The Historical Society Museum has Officially REOPENED!

After a long, two-year renovation, our Historical Society Museum has officially reopened and we are ready to resume regular schedule - every 2nd Sunday of the month from

11:00 am to 2:00 pm.

When we started the renovation, our dream for the space was a museum that was focused on Temple City's history, and the Temple family. Another item on our dream list was to make it more interactive. All this while making it a place where our community could learn more about our special town and the history that makes Temple City such a unique place. We now have two (2) interactive displays: the beautiful Temple-Workman Family Tree and our "hands on" exhibit of historic kitchen items.







In 2023 Temple City will be celebrating the 100th Anniversary of its founding in May. Our city was started as a community where middle-class families could afford to buy a home in a small town, and that same small town feel is still alive in our community today. The museum celebrates this 100 year history and the family that started it While Walter Temple was important to our town's founding, one area of the museum acknowledges the important influence of the Temple family on the early history of Los Angeles. We are especially proud of the collage wall featuring a timeline of Temple City's history and several historic photos from Temple City's early history.

On October 9, 2022 we had our Official Grand Reopening, which was followed by a Teacher Preview Day, and on December 11th we began our first regular Sunday hours. 
