As many of you are aware, the Historical Society building, which we all love, was a gift from the Woman's Club of Temple City to the Historical Society in 2006. The gift, however, came with stipulations that are outlined in the Agreement Re: Woman's Clubhouse & Property, a copy of which is available for review on our website

The Agreement served a dutiful purpose by establishing a framework for both organizations at the time of the transfer; however, it is outdated and requires modernization and fresh eyes to establish continuity for the future. The Historical Society reached out to the Woman's Club of Temple City and a virtual joint meeting was held between Officers of both organizations. The goal is to develop a comprehensive Addendum to the original Agreement that will withstand the test of time and provide clear guidance as to use, access, duties, etc., rather than simply relying upon continued good will. Discussions continue, and should consensus between the two organizations be reached, the proposed Addendum will be brought before the membership of both organizations for a vote prior to adoption.

At this, time we are researching the possibility of holding a General Membership Meeting, virtually, before the end of the year. More details will be provided as they are finalized.

The next Board Meeting will be held on Monday, October 12th at 7:00 pm via Zoom.
